

GUILD BIRTHDAY PARTY AT COLMA TOWN HALL, JAN. 23

Once a year our Guild visits the beautiful Council Chambers of the Township of Colma to celebrate the **BIRTHDAY OF THE GUILD!** Complete with a splendid speaker, champagne, special goodies, cake and lots of fun, the 12th Year of Formal Existence of the Guild will be celebrated on **SUNDAY, JANUARY 23rd**, from 2:00p to 4:00p.

This is always a very special time, and that's why we don't publicize it in the papers, for it is for **MEMBERS ONLY.** This is mostly due to the limited seating capacity in the Council Chambers...100 chairs, plus a little standing room around the edges.

Our speaker for the day will be **Kent Seavey**, who has recently completed an **Historic Resources Inventory** for the Township of Colma. In cooperation with the San Mateo County Historical Association, and the Township, **Mr. Seavey** has made a most comprehensive study of the architectural assets of Colma, depicted them in their historical perspective, and published the results in a workman-like report.


His methodology, evaluation criteria, descriptions and significances will be highlighted during his presentation.

We might note that **Kent** has made an investigation along parallel lines in Daly City via extensive conversations and a thorough windshield tour, where many of the divergent and historical sites of DC were covered.


Mr. Seavey received his formal education at San Francisco State and Stanford Universities. A museum professional, historical coordinator, teacher of local history (including art and architecture), he has made historic preservation studies for communities of San Juan Batista, Salinas, San Carlos, Belmont and Colma.

MINI-MUSEUM ATTENDANCE

You might be curious as to the numbers of visitors to our Daly City History Mini-Museum in the first 16 months of existence, since September 8, 1992 through Dec. 21, 1993.

Open on Tuesdays only, 1:30p to 4:00p, we have greeted 695 guests who have signed the Guest Book. This works out to about 10 visitors each week.

While this doesn't seem overwhelming, we must remember that the open hours are limited, 1½ hours weekly, during school hours. Originally it was hoped that school groups would be hosted, but the local schools are precluded from having anyone except family members

driving their children on field trips, and there isn't money for hiring buses, so the attendance from schoolchildren has been limited.

Obviously the answer is to have more volunteers from the Guild to act as greeters for visitors on extended or differing days of the week.

We are proud, however, of our first year plus of existence, and look forward to increased service to the community.

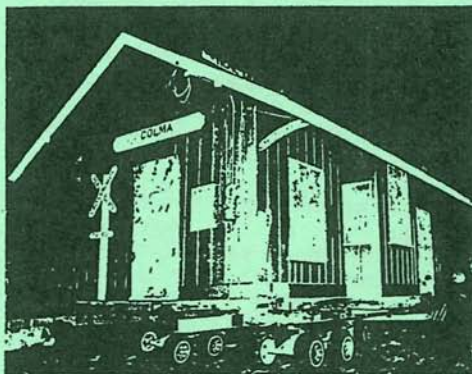
POETRY CONTEST FEB. 4
