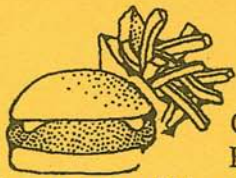


REFRESHMENT DONORS FOR MAY 16 MEETING

NOTE FROM THE PAST

Eye-catching to some was a March public notice in the *Examiner* regarding vacating of an unused portion of Railroad Ave. right of way near Citrus Ave. Sharp eyes noted that the property was part of a "Survey of 13 Lots at Colma for **R.S. Thornton, ESQ.**" An accompanying map was dated Sept. 30, 1891. A public hearing was held April 9, 2007, at DC City Hall. FYI: **Robert Sheldon Thornton** is historically credited with settling, in 1853, in the then-wilderness of what is now Daly City and Colma. He pioneered, and prospered.

GUILD MOUNTAIN 'TRIP' WITH DAVID SCHOOLEY

San Bruno Mountain's personable and dedicated preservationist, David Schooley, was the speaker for the March meeting of the History Guild. By way of photographic slides and sharing of personal knowledge, the speaker allowed attendees to romp the mountain vicariously and savor as they sat some of the here-to-fore secrets of the north county's largest and most enduring landmark. He was introduced by HG vice-president Richard Rocchetta.

Representing Mountain Watch, Mr. Schooley spoke of the plight of endangered butterflies, fauna and flora that have lived on the Mountain for thousands of years and ongoing threats posed to their habitat by man-made objectives in the name of progress.

Also on hand to share some of his collection of Mountain visuals and knowledge was charter HG vice president Neil Fahy, who had presented a history of the Mountain for the HG in May of 1992. In past years, Neil and David have collaborated on several publications regarding the Mountain. Schooley had previously spoken to the Guild in May of 2000
